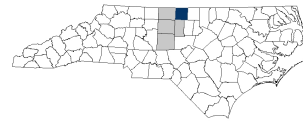

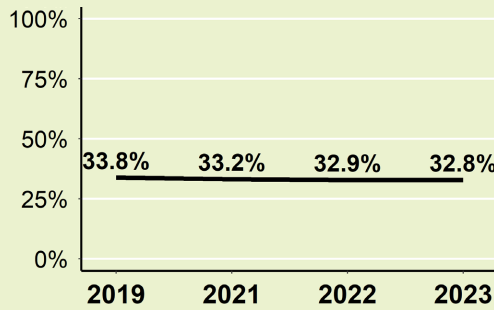

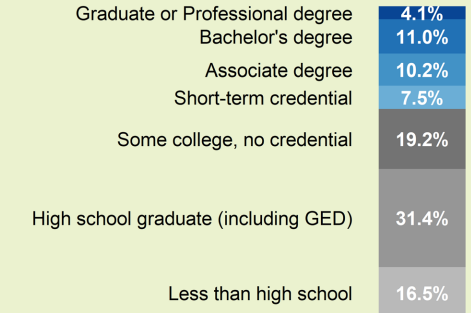

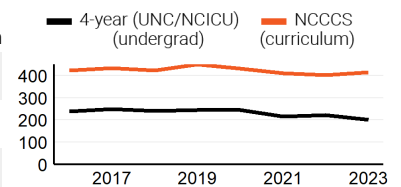

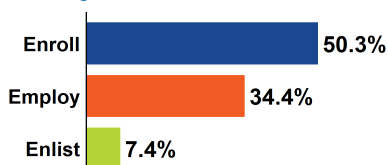


FAFSA Completion

46% of Caswell County high school seniors complete the FAFSA, below the rural - non-metro county average of 54%.

45.7% of 2024 high school class completed the FAFSA as of Sept. 27, 2024. 48 more need to complete in 2024 to meet state goal of 80%. Peer: 54.0% | State: 55.0%

Post High School Graduation Intentions

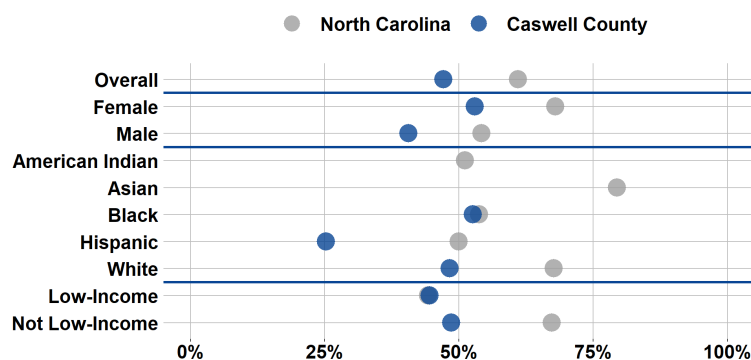


54.2% of students have parents with no college degree (either 2- or 4-year) 2023

Math Performance

17% of Caswell County 3-8 graders earn college-and-career-ready scores in Math, below the rural - non-metro county average of 30%.

Caswell County has met the goal for Pre-K enrollment. (Goal: 75%). Peer: 71.0% | State: 57.2% 2024

Note: Enrollment numbers only include students served by the NC Pre-K Program and may not represent all Pre-K offerings available.

Caswell County Traditional Public Schools students:

18.5% of 3-8 graders earned college-and-career-ready scores in reading in 2024. 486 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. Peer: 24.5% | State: 29.8%

16.7% of 3-8 graders earned college-and-career-ready scores in math in 2024. 618 more needed to meet state goal of 86%. Peer: 30.3% | State: 36.5%

38.0% of students were chronically absent from school in 2024. 602 fewer needed to meet state goal of 11%. Peer: 27.7% | State: 25.7%



Caswell County has a student-to-school counselor ratio of 338:1 compared to 332:1 in peer counties. 2024

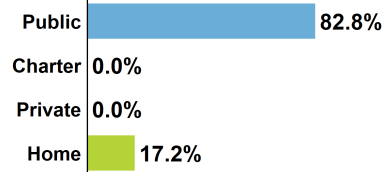

Pathways to College and Career

Students in traditional public schools completed 418 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials and 80 concentrations. 65 (15.6%) of credentials were industry-valued in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations: Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources; Manufacturing; and Human Services.



Less than 10 (<5%) high school students took at least one AP, IB, or CIE exam. State: 16.8% (2023).



64 (39.8%) high school graduates participated in Career & College Promise programs. State: 36.0% (2024).
