








Postsecondary Enrollment

55% of Polk County seniors enroll in postsecondary education within 12 months of graduation, below the state average of 59%.

62.4% of 2024 high school class completed the FAFSA as of Sept. 27, 2024. 25 more need to complete in 2024 to meet state goal of 80%. Peer: 54.0% | State: 55.0%


Post High School Graduation Intentions

Math Performance

43% of Polk County 3-8 graders earn college-and-career-ready scores in Math, below the state goal of 86%.

Polk County has met the goal for Pre-K enrollment. (Goal: 75%). Peer: 71.0% | State: 57.2% 2024

Polk County Traditional Public Schools students:

40.3% of 3-8 graders earned college-and-career-ready scores in reading in 2024. 304 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. Peer: 24.5% | State: 29.8%

42.5% of 3-8 graders earned college-and-career-ready scores in math in 2024. 404 more needed to meet state goal of 86%. Peer: 30.3% | State: 36.5%

22.0% of students were chronically absent from school in 2024. 237 fewer needed to meet state goal of 11%. Peer: 27.7% | State: 25.7%



Polk County has a student-to-school counselor ratio of 222:1 compared to 332:1 in peer counties. 2024



Pathways to College and Career

Students in traditional public schools completed 996 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials and 141 concentrations. 142 (14.3%) of credentials were industry-valued in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations: Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources; Health Science; and Information Technology.



38 (6.3%) high school students took at least one AP, IB, or CIE exam. State: 16.8% (2023).



95 (65.5%) high school graduates participated in Career & College Promise programs. State: 36.0% (2024).
